

HOME LEARNING OFFER

PAPER-BASED activities to be provided

- A weekly timetable to include a daily English lesson, maths lesson and wider curriculum lesson
- English: A unit of work to last for up to 14 days leading to a writing outcome
- Maths: Worksheets / workbook to accompanying daily lesson videos from White Rose Premium
- Wider curriculum: Daily lesson, linked to planned theme. Oak Academy online lessons will be used to support this where appropriate. There may be some accompanying worksheets to support this.

ONLINE activities to be provided

- Morning Zoom session / learning check in (30-40mins) – a whole class phonics or reading lesson will be delivered to BOTH pupils in school and pupils at home. (Zoom log-in details will be shared on Class Dojo pages each day)
- Maths: Daily video lesson from White Rose Premium. Teacher may create additional videos to ‘model’ mathematical concepts.
- Wider curriculum: Daily lesson video from Oak Academy, where appropriate to support the planned learning
- **Class Dojo Portfolios** – pupils should upload examples of work to their Portfolio’s once they have completed activities at home (*see separate instructions sheet on how to use Portfolios*)
- Afternoon Zoom marking and feedback session (20-30mins). Teachers will go through maths and English work that has been completed that day, and share examples of work in Portfolios. . (Zoom log-in details will be shared on Class Dojo pages each day)
- Athletics activities assigned
- TTRS access for KS2 OR Numbots for KS1 pupils

Providing feedback on pupil’s work

Class Dojo Portfolios: Pupils should upload work for teachers to see and provide feedback

The afternoon Zoom session will provide pupils with general feedback on the learning for the day

Keeping in touch with pupils and parents

Staff will be accessing Class Dojo at various points through the day. If your question or comment is urgent, please contact the office.

Pupils who are learning at home are expected to access the daily Zoom sessions as much as possible, and upload work to Class Dojo Portfolios.

If your child will not be able to access a particular session, please inform the class teacher via message

Staff will contact families via telephone if there has been no attendance on the Zoom sessions and no engagement with Portfolios for more than a day.

Home visits will be conducted to check on pupil well-being when staff are not able to contact families via telephone.

How to stay safe when using Zoom

- Pupils should access devices in a supervised area in the house – not a bedroom or bathroom
- Parents should supervise pupils on Zoom at all times, as the official age rating for using Zoom is 16 years.
- Pupils should be dressed appropriately when using Zoom – not in pyjamas or just underwear
- Appropriate usernames should be used so the teacher knows exactly who is trying to access the session
- Background distractions should be kept to a minimum – e.g. T.V. turned off
- Parents should carefully monitor pupil's use of the 'chat' facility
